Thankfully, the next section of the catechism is entitled "Deliverance" where we'll learn what God has done to deliver us from our misery. Lord's Day 4

Q9. But doesn't God do us an injustice by requiring in his law what we are unable to do?

A. No, God created human beings with the ability to keep the law. They, however, provoked by the devil, in willful disobedience, robbed themselves and all their descendants of these gifts.

Q10. Does God permit such disobedience and rebellion to go unpunished?

A. Certainly not. God is terribly angry with the sin we are born with as well as the sins we personally commit.

As a just judge, God will punish them both now and in eternity, having declared: "Cursed is everyone who does not observe and obey all the things written in the book of the law."

#### Q11. But isn't God also merciful?

A. God is certainly merciful, but also just. God's justice demands that sin, committed against his supreme majesty, be punished with the supreme penalty — eternal punishment of body and soul.

Classis Update - On October 11 - 12, 31 Christian Reformed churches in northern Alberta met together as a Classis at Trinity CRC in Edmonton. Classis meets twice a year with the goal of mutual encouragement and ministry.

The Minutes of this meeting are available on our new and improved Classis website at classisalbertanorth.ca, but we do want to share some highlights with you.

We were privileged to celebrate how God continues to bless the Church with people called to be Ministers of the Word. Five people whom He called to this ministry were examined by Classis and ordained in this office. They are Ryan H, who accepted a call to the La Glace CRC; Michael M, who joins the pastoral staff at Trinity CRC in Edmonton; Joshua F, the new pastor at Evergreen CRC in Ft. McMurray; Ryan P who continues to serve Bethel Community CRC in Edmonton as Associate Pastor; and Brian D, who accepted the call of First CRC in Edmonton. We pray the Lord's blessing on them as they shepherd His sheep.

On Wednesday evening, Dr. Lyle B from Calvin Seminary helped us commemorate Martin Luther's initiation of the Protestant Reformation 500 years ago. He challenged us to consider how, in our changing culture, we are called to be an ever-reforming church in obedience to the Word of God.

We were able to thank Roy B on his retirement as Minister of the Word, for his many years of service to our denomination and our Classis.

We also thanked Rick V for serving us as Chaplain at the Univ. of Alberta for 10 years. He will be moving to Korea, and the Campus Ministry Committee is seeking a person who can fill this position. They are also looking for someone to serve as a very part-time chaplain at NAIT.

Classis decided that we need a full-time Youth Consultant to fill the vacancy left by Ron D. The Classis Youth Ministry Committee is seeking applications for this position.
