We have begun deliberations and actions towards developing a new vision for our church. It's been quite some time since our last one was developed and based on the survey completed at the beginning of our search for a new pastor (2015-2016), the feedback indicated that there was a strong congregational desire to revisit our vision statement. Rest assured, your further input will be sought and highly valued when the time comes.

We, as a council, are encouraged by the high numbers of people who have completed their Safe Church requirements. 
