Council Highlights

The following are the Council Highlights from our **February Meeting**:

Our clerk Grace B was unable to attend our February meeting so these highlights are a little late and this report was written by Pastor Jason.

As always we opened our meeting with devotions and prayer for the congregation. We discussed the Lord's Supper at Ebenezer and approved a document composed by pastor Jason which articulates our theological understanding of what Lord's Supper is and who may participate. This document does not represent a change in our views or practice but summarizes what we are already doing. It is available for anyone who would like to read it.

We appreciate the work of the Ushers and Greeters. We're thankful for everyone who serves in those capacities and we are considering ways we can support and equip those individuals in the areas of seating procedures, emergency response and "Safe Church" considerations.

We received a letter from King's University regarding recent articles written in the Edmonton Journal regarding their new position on issues related to sexual ethics. In response we determined that we will contact the University and request a visit from a representative so that we can continue the dialogue.

We discussed the ongoing question of our Thanksgiving Day service. Some time ago we received feedback from members of the congregation who would like to see this service reinstituted, and after discussing it, we decided to reinstitute this service for 2019. But after making that decision we received feedback from other members who preferred the Thanksgiving service to be held on the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving. We were also made aware of previous work done by the Worship Committee on this subject and asked that they share with us the history of why the decision was made not to have a Monday service. They provided an explanation of why the decision was made and they also gave a recommendation for our Thanksgiving services moving forward. After further considering the issue, council has decided to follow the recommendation of the Worship Committee and continue to hold our Thanksgiving service on the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving. Thank you to everyone who provided valuable feedback on this issue.

We began the process of nominating candidates for council. Please provide us with the names of anyone that you would like to nominate. That is just a short summary of what was a long and fruitful meeting. It is a joy for us to serve the church on council and we thank you for your ongoing feedback, prayers and support.
